The nearest stations to the venue are Warwick Parkway and Kenilworth. The hotel advises that Warwick Parkway is the better serviced by taxis and Uber.



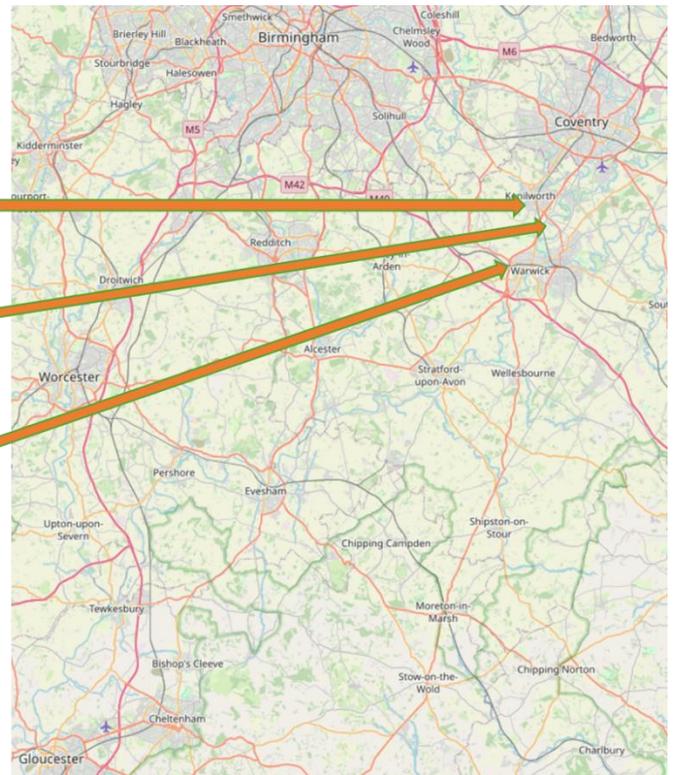
